Hoping for More of the Same

The last time these two sides met, Detroit City FC took an early lead due to a header from #11 Connor Rutz in the fifth minute of the match and then played the last 85 minutes comfortably controlling possession and keeping Indy Eleven at a distance.

Indy Eleven Coming in HOT

The last time Detroit City FC faced off against Indy Eleven, Indy were in the middle of a five match winless streak with a goal-differential in that span of -8. This time is different, over the last two matches Indy Eleven have defeated Western Conference leaders San Antonio FC and Eastern Conference leaders Louisville City FC by scores of 1-0 and 2-1 respectively. Confidence will be flowing from the visitors on Saturday night.

Pato Botello Faz - Man in the Middle

Pato Botello Faz scored two goals on the road against the Charleston Battery the last time Le Rouge took the pitch. This was his first goal since scoring Detroit City FC's only goal in the 1-1 draw against Hartford Athletic on July 6. If Detroit City FC wants to host a playoff match, they will need their striker to continue the form he started against the Battery on the road.

HELLO, OLD FRIEND

On Saturday when Indy Eleven comes to town, it will be the first time that Trevor James will take on his old employers in a competitive match. Detroit City FC and Indy Eleven have played friendlies every year dating back to 2019 and this will be the first ever competitive matchup at Keyworth Stadium. Le Rouge won on the road 1-0 in Indianapolis on July 9 but Trevor James did not travel with the squad to Indy as he was feeling under the weather.

PLAYOFF PUSH WELL AND TRULY ON

Detroit City FC now have eight matches remaining in the USL Championship regular season and they are deeply involved in the playoff push. Their biggest threat to falling out of the top seven is FC Tulsa who find themselves eight points back but having played a match more than Le Rouge. Detroit City FC are still pushing hard to

get into the top-four to host a playoff match but are facing an uphill battle as they currently sit eight points behind fourth place having played a game less.

PATO BOTELLO FAZ: TEAM OF THE WEEK - WK. 25

xG LOOKING X-TRA GOOD

Last time out Detroit City FC had their best Expected Goals showing of the season so far in the 3-0 win on the road against the Charleston Battery. Detroit City FC generated 2.8 expected goals while only allowing 0.7xG out of their opponents. This xG Differential of +2.1 is their best of the season. Expected Goals is a metric that measures the quality of any given chance in front of goal. The xG numbers referenced in this notes document are from the models from fivethirtyeight.com

MATT LEWIS: TEAM OF THE WEEK - WK. 24

#15 Matt Lewis was named to the USL Championship Team of the Week for Week 24 thanks to his showing in the 2-1 win on the road against Birmingham Legion FC on 8/17. In the match against the Legion, Matt Lewis scored the game winner, a header off of a corner delivered by #29 Antoine Hoppenot. Lewis also had 11 clearances in the match and played 90' as part of the Detroit City FC backline. His game winner in Alabama was his first ever goal in the USL Championship.

WHEN RUTZ SCORES IT MEANS THREE POINTS

Connor Rutz has scored in three separate matches this season for Detroit City FC and Le Rouge has gone on to win all three (two of them being direct game winners). This is a trend that goes all the way back to Connor's first season for Le Rouge in 2020. When Connor Rutz scores a goal, Detroit City FC's record in those matches is a flawless 11-0-0.

CONNOR RUTZ: MADE FOR SPORTSCENTER

On 8/17 on the road against Birmingham Legion FC #11 Connor Rutz opened the scoring with a bicycle-kick following a cross from the wing from #29 Antoine Hoppenot. This was Rutz's third goal of the season but his first that was not a header. Rutz's acrobatic finish landed him a spot on SportsCenter's Top Plays, coming in at #6. This is Rutz's second bicycle kick in the last year, his first coming on September 11 against New Amsterdam FC. That strike earned him #1 on SportsCenter's top plays.

ANTOINE HOPPENOT MOVES INTO THE TOP FIVE

Over the last three matches, #29 Antoine Hoppenot has registered three assists. One on Saturday 8/13 against the Oakland Roots and two on the road on 8/17 against the Birmingham Legion. With these three assists, Antoine Hoppenot is now at 41 all-time assists in his career in the USL Championship. Moving him into the top-five all time. Hoppenot is currently 13 assists behind the all-time top spot which is currently held by Kenardo Forbes of the Riverhounds. Forbes has registered 54 assists in the USL Championship all time.

WELCOME TO LE ROUGE: RICHARD FOSTER

On Monday, Detroit City FC announced the signing of journeyman Scottish footballer Richard Foster. Foster appeared in 400 matches in the Scottish Premiership, most notably for Rangers FC. Richard will also be joining Trevor James's first team staff as he is also a holder of a UEFA-A Level coaching license.

WELCOME TO LE ROUGE: YAZEED MATTHEWS

On Saturday, Detroit City FC announced the re-signing of forward Yazeed Matthews. Yazeed first joined Detroit City FC in 2019 ahead of the 2019 NPSL Members Cup and was a key asset on the team that went on to win the competition. From there, Matthews came back in 2020 and 2021 and was an influential member of both squads. Yazeed will wear #27 and is cleared to appear for the first time on the road against the Birmingham Legion this Wednesday.

MAXI RODRIGUEZ: TEAM OF THE WEEK - WK 20

Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez was named to the USL Championship Team of the Week for week 20. He earned this honor after his showing against New Mexico United FC. Rodriguez played all 90', scoring a goal and having a 81.8% passing completion percentage. This is the fourth time Rodriguez has been awarded this weekly honor this season.

MID-SEASON AWARD WINNERS

Detroit City FC won big in the USL Mid-Season awards. Defender Deklan Wynne was named the Mid-Season Defender of the Season, goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher was awarded the Mid-Season Goalkeeper of the Season award and Detroit City FC General Manager and Head Coach Trevor James bagged the Mid-Season Head Coach of the Season Award.

BILLY FORBES LOANED TO THE CANADIAN PREMIER LEAGUE

On Thursday July 21, Detroit City FC announced that winger Billy Forbes has joined Canadian Premier League side Valour FC on loan. In his time with Le Rouge this season, Billy Forbes made six appearances and tallied 194 minutes played in the Rouge and Gold.

WELCOME TO DETROIT CITY FC, DOMINIC GASSO

On Tuesday July 5, Le Rouge announced the signing of Dominick Gasso. Gasso formerly played for the Flint City Bucks Academy, Vardar Soccer Academy and he also represented Le Rouge in the USL Academy Cup. Gasso will be eligible to compete not only for Le Rouge's first team, but also the Academy Cup squad.

DEFENDERS AND THEN SOME

Detroit City FC has registered 24 assists in its 26 matches in the USL Championship this year. Of those 24, 11 of them have come from players who are registered as defenders. Leading the way for the defenders club is #20 Deklan Wynne who picked up his sixth assist of the year on the road against Indy Eleven with a beautifully placed ball to the head of Connor Rutz. Rhys Williams has three assists himself while centerbacks Devon Amoo-Mensah and Matt Lewis have one assist each.

TO THOSE WHO WAIT...

After 1,286 minutes in the USL Championship this season and getting off a team-high 22 shots after 17 matches in this years campaign, #11 Connor Rutz opened his scoring tally in the USL in the 63rd minute with a well placed header against Las Vegas Lights FC in Detroit City FC's 1-0 win in the Sin City on July 2. It had been 1,343 minutes of play since Rutz last found the back of the net in league play, going all the way back to the 3-2 win over the Michigan Stars on November 20, 2021.

STEVE CARROLL: WEEK 15 TEAM OF THE WEEK

Stephen Carroll made his first appearance on the Team of the Week. The Irish center back won eight of 11 duels and won three tackles. Carroll made eight clearances, six interceptions and five recoveries in Le Rouge's 1-1 draw against El Paso Locomotive FC on ESPN. Carroll is currently ranked No. 24 in FotMob's Top-100 players in the USL Championship with an average rating of 7.42.

LONG TIME SINCE...

Before the 2-0 loss to Sacramento Republic FC on June 11, it had been 648 days since Detroit City FC last lost by a multiple-goal deficit at Keyworth Stadium, the most recent time this occurred was against the Michigan Stars in the NISA 2020 Fall Championship bubble tournament. The last time Detroit City FC lost by a multiple goal deficit in a league match in front of its home fans was all the way back in 2018 when Le Rouge lost 2-0 to Grand Rapids FC on June 17, 2018. A staggering 1,455 days.

LEARNING FROM MISTAKES

Detroit City FC has never lost back-to-back games under Trevor James. The last time Le Rouge has lost back-to-back fixtures was July 10 and 15, 2016, to Lansing United and Michigan Stars, respectively.

A SOLD OUT CROWD AT KEYWORTH

June 18th's match at Keyworth Stadium marked just the second time that Le Rouge has announced an official sellout at Keyworth and first-ever presale sellout. During the 2017 NPSL playoffs, DCFC sold out for the national semifinals against Midland-Odessa. The attendance was announced at 7,553.

DEFYING THE XG NUMBERS

Through 26 games this season Detroit City FC has a goal differential of +10. This is even more impressive when you look at the underlying numbers such as xG. Through 26 matches Le Rouge has an xG differential of 0.6xG. Their best xG performance of the season came in the 2-1 win at Hartford Athletic where they generated 2.8 expected goals. Their worst xG performance of the season came in June 4's 1-1 draw away to the Riverhounds where they allowed Pittsburgh to generate 2.3 expected goals. xG numbers used are based off of models from fivethirtyeight.com.

STAYING DISCIPLINED

Detroit City FC is one of the least penalized teams in the USL Championship conceding just 298 fouls through 26 matches - ranking second in the league. Las Vegas leads the category at just 247 fouls. Le Rouge sits second in the league in fewest yellow cards with 49. DCFC remains one of two teams without a red card this year alongside The Miami FC.

TURNING UP THE PRESSURE

Detroit City sits in third place in the league in winning possession in the final third, causing 6.2 turnovers per match in the attacking end of the pitch per match. At Keyworth Stadium on May 21, forward Antoine Hoppenot won the ball off Atlanta United II's keeper in the box and slotted it for his fifth goal of the season. Le Rouge ranks inside the USL Championship top seven with 315 interceptions - coming out to 12.1 per match.

NO REST FOR THE WEARY: PLAYING EVERY MINUTE OF 2022 THUS FAR

Nate Steinwascher has played every minute of every match this season - including three Open Cup fixtures, totaling 2,640 minutes of play. Left back Deklan Wynne has started every fixture this season as well.

NATE STEINMONSTER

Goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher has posted 30 clean sheets in 55 matches since 2020. Steinwascher ranks fifth with eight clean sheets this year and sits second with 79 saves among all USL Championship keepers. Steinwascher's PK save in week one at San Antonio was named Save of the Month by the league - he's earned seven save of the week nominations.

CITY'S DEFENSE UNDER TREVOR JAMES

Detroit City sits third with 24 goals conceded this season, with Louisville City FC leading the league at 19. Le Rouge led the USL Championship in goals conceded at four through April and didn't surrender multiple goals until May 7 at FC Tulsa (L, 3-1). Under Trevor James, Detroit City has allowed more than one goal in a match in just 12 of the Gaffer's 100 matches with the Club.

THREE-PLUS GOAL PERFORMANCES

Detroit City FC's three-goal performance win on the road against the Charleston Battery on 8/27 was the fifth three-plus goal effort by Detroit City FC this season. Le Rouge tallied three in the Open Cup against the Michigan Stars on April 5 and four on the road at Atlanta United 2 on April 9. In two of those matches, DCFC went to the locker room up 3-0. Under Trevor James, Le Rouge has scored more than three goals in 32 matches since 2019 - highs of 10 v Livonia City FC in 2021 NISA Independent Cup and 6-1 at New Amsterdam FC on Sept. 29, 2021 in league play.

BREAKING DOWN CITY'S 34 GOALS IN LEAGUE PLAY

Le Rouge has netted 34 goals this league season through 26 matches. All 34 of City's goals have come inside the box and primarily have come off the right foot - 20 of 34. Le Rouge has just four headers that found the back of the net in league play this year, coming from Antoine Hoppenot on April 9 at Atlanta United 2 and Connor Rutz against Las Vegas Lights on July 2, Connor Rutz's header at Indy Eleven on July 9 and most recently Matt Lewis' winner against Birmingham Legion on 8/17. Hoppenot's was his first-ever professional goal scored from a header.

NEW KIDS MAKING NOISE

Detroit City FC went 6-2-2 in its first 10 matches as members of the USL Championship, amassing 20 points which matches the Tampa Rowdies of 2017 as the best start in league history for a new

member. Le Rouge's +8 goal differential through the first 10 matches is tied with 2019 New Mexico United for the second-best mark to start a tenure in the USL Championship, with the 2017 Rowdies boasting a differential of +9. Since 2017, nine of 19 expansion sides have made the playoffs.

SWISS ARMY KNIFE: MICHAEL BRYANT

Due in part to piling injuries, Bryant began seeing more consistent minutes and has now started as an attacking mid, right back and center back this season. Bryant scored two goals in May and has netted three on the season.

LE ROUGE IN FOTMOB'S TOP100

Through week 26 of the 2022 season, DCFC ranks eighth in the USL Championship with an average team rating of 6.96. Seven Le Rouge players earned ratings inside FotMob's Top 100 players in the USL Championship this week. Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez leads the way for City, coming in 13th place; he was tied with Aaron Molloy for first prior to the Sacramento Republic FC match on June 11.

MAXI RODRIGUEZ: TEAM OF THE WEEK - WK 10

For the third time this season, midfielder Maxi Rodriguez was named to the USL Championship's team of the week (weeks 3, 7, 10). Rodriguez scored once in Le Rouge's 4-2 victory over Loudoun United on May 14 and had a pair of shots to add to an industrious display in midfield where he won 12 of 17 duels and 4 of 6 tackles while recording 13 recoveries and three interceptions for City.

THREE GOALS ALLOWED AT FC TULSA

Le Rouge's three goals allowed at FC Tulsa on May 7 was the most goals surrendered under Trevor James and most since allowing four at Kalamazoo FC on July 7, 2018.

MAGIC U.S. OPEN CUP RUN ENDS IN PENALTIES

Detroit City's run through the 107th Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup came to an end in penalties on May 10 in the Round of 32 against Louisville City. After a 14th minute PK from Maxi Rodriguez - setup by a run from Francis Atuahene - Lou City responded 10 minutes later with an equalizer and would win 4-2 in penalties. Le Rouge defeated the Michigan Stars, 3-0, in the second round and the Columbus Crew, 2-1, in round three. DCFC advanced out of the second round for the first time in Club history.

COACH OF THE MONTH TREVOR JAMES

Trevor James was named the USL Championship's Manager of the Month for the month of April. Detroit City went 6-1-0 through April with a +13 goal differential. Le Rouge posted four clean sheets and defeated the MLS' Columbus Crew in the third round of the Open Cup during the unbeaten run. City's longest unbeaten streak came to a close last fall, going 27 matches without a loss, setting a record among active professional leagues in the U.S.

WELCOME TO DETROIT CITY, KARL OUIMETTE

Le Rouge announced the season-long loan of Karl Ouimette on May 2 from Indy Eleven. Ouimette has 100 appearances with Indy since 2018 - totaling seven goals. The centerback began his professional career with the Montreal Impact before signing with the NY Red Bulls in 2015, making 15 appearances for the MLS side. Ouimette has made 18 caps for the Canadian national team - most recently in 2016.

COOL AS YOU LIKE: MAXI RODRIGUEZ FROM THE SPOT

Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez' opened the scoring from the spot against New Mexico United FC on July 23 - it was his fourth PK of 2022 and seventh since coming to Detroit in 2021. Rodriguez took over the penalty kick duties in the fall of 2021, going 4-of-4 from spot last fall and 4-of-4 thus far this season - remaining perfect while donning Rouge and Gold. He also netted his attempt in the shootout against Lou City on May 10 in the 2022 Open Cup.

**WELCOME TO DETROIT, MACKY DIOP**

On Wednesday, April 27, Le Rouge announced the trade of Macky Diop from Birmingham Legion. The terms of the deal were undisclosed. Diop made nine appearances and two starts in 2022 ahead of coming to Detroit. Before signing with Birmingham, Diop scored nine goals for Atlanta United 2 from 2020-21 while playing with DCFC's Laye Diop. The Dakar, Senegal, native came to the U.S. to play college soccer, tallying 13 goals in 16 appearances for Radford University.

MAXI RODRIGUEZ NAMED TO TOTW - WK 7

Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez was named to the USL Championship's Team of the Week for the second time this season (team of the week after week three v Pittsburgh). Rodriguez helped drive Detroit to a 2-1 victory at Hartford Athletic on April 24, completing 55 of 67 passes and recording one assist, two shots and four chances created while also making four interceptions and nine recoveries.

DETROIT CITY IS THE BUZZ AROUND TOWN

Our Open Cup match was our highest engagement date on social media in the past year. On April 19, we received nearly 29,000 engagements across all platforms. We were second in the league for total engagement and generated over \$21,000 in brand valuation for our sponsors. Our 3 second video views were in the top 50% of all professional sports teams on Facebook and in the top 25% of reactions to our videos across the past two weeks.

UNDEFEATED V THE MLS

In its first-ever match against an MLS side, Detroit City FC knocked off the Columbus Crew, 2-1, to advance to the round of 32 of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez had a second-half brace - with the winner coming from the PK spot in the 86th minute. The Crew's lone goal came in the 7th minute on a PK from Gyasi Zardes - a former Academy signing of Trevor James while the duo were with the LA Galaxy.

WILLIAMS, STEINWASCHER EARN TOTW - WK 6

Following Le Rouges 1-0 victory over Birmingham Legion on April 15, right back Rhys Williams and goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher earned league plaudits. Williams earned a spot on the team of the week - for the second time this season - after another strong defensive performance, winning 14 of 20 duels and 7 of 8 tackles while making four interceptions and 15 recoveries. Steinwascher earned honorable mention honors making four stops - including a crucial one late for his 25th clean sheet in 40 matches since 2020.

HOPPENOT, AMOO-MENSAH NAMED TO TOTW - WK 5

Forward Antoine Hoppenot and centerback Devon Amoo-Mensah were named to week five's USL Championship Team of the Week. Hoppenot recorded one goal and one assist, had four chances created and two shots and won 7 of 12 duels to lead DCFC's 4-0 victory against Atlanta United 2. Amoo-Mensah recorded one assist, had two chances created and completed 51 of 57 passes while making 13 recoveries in the win.

HOPPENOT'S WEEK 5 TALLY NOMINATED FOR GOTW

Antoine Hoppenot's header in the 33rd minute at Atlanta United 2 was nominated for week five's USL Championship Goal of the Week. It was right back Rhys Williams' second assist of the season and Hoppenot's second goal. Week five's tally was the first goal he's scored professionally off a header.

STEINWASCHER EARNS SAVE OF THE MONTH HONORS

Goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher made a lot of noise to start the season, earning three-straight save of the week nominations. His week one penalty stop at San Antonio FC won the league's Save of the Month honor for March. The first-half stop kept the game scoreless and swung momentum into City's direction. After three-straight save of the week nominations to open the season, Steinwascher has only seen two shots since as Le Rouge's backline has gone more than two matches now without allowing a shot on frame.

RODRIGUEZ NAMED TO LEAGUE'S TEAM OF THE WEEK - WK 5

Midfielder Maxi Rodriguez tallied the equalizer in the 73rd minute last weekend against the league's top offense in the Pittsburgh Riverhounds, beating the keeper just inside the left post from the penalty spot. Rodriguez was named to the USL's Team of the Week following his performance - completing 49 of 61 passes and winning 12 of 15 duels. Rodriguez is the second City player named to a TOTW this season, as goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher earned a spot on week one's TOTW.

STEINWASCHER WITH 3-STRAIGHT SAVE OF THE WEEK NOMINATIONS

Nate Steinwascher has made multiple big saves already this season and earned three-straight Save of the Week nominations to open the campaign. Week three versus Pittsburgh, the Riverhounds outshot DCFC 7-1 in the first half, forcing two diving stops from Steinwascher - highlighted by going fully horizontal to turn aside a streaking header in the 17th minute. In week two v Charleston, Steinwascher faced just one shot on frame - coming in the 91st minute. The former all-state center-back at Sterling Heights Stevenson high school made a kick-toe save to secure City's three points. In week one at San Antonio, Steinwascher turned aside a penalty kick in the 19th minute to keep the match scoreless.

DOMINATING THE THIRD DIVISION

Detroit City finished its time in U.S. Soccer's third division with a +42 goal differential over 36 matches played (excludes NISA Independent Cup matches). Le Rouge won the NISA 2020 Fall Tournament, 2020 NISA Independent Cup Great Lakes Region, 2021 NISA Legends Cup, 2021 NISA Spring Season, 2020-21 NISA Championship, 2021 NISA Independent Cup Great Lakes Region and 2021 NISA Fall Season. Every trophy available during DCFC's time in NISA, the Club won. During the run, City set a new U.S. Professional Soccer record (among active pro leagues), going 27 matches without a loss.

BRINGING THE BEST OF NISA WITH US

Making the jump from NISA to the USL Championship with City is a core group that was a part of the Club's 2021 run through the third division. In total, seven different members of Detroit City's roster either won a yearly award or were named to the all-league team in 2021. Additionally, DCFC welcomed captains from two other NISA clubs in Michael Bryant (formerly Cal United Strikers) and Devon Amoo-Mensah (formerly Michigan Stars).

U19 BOYS TAKE THIRD AT USL ACADEMY CUP

Le Rouge's youth programming has been the fastest-growing aspect of the Club over the past few seasons. DCFC teamed up with local youth clubs, creating an affiliate network throughout Metro Detroit. City made its Academy debut from March 31-April 3 at the second-annual USL Academy Cup, finishing third in the Premiere Division. Bosh Tanyi, who splits time between the Academy and USL Championship side, netted the match-winner on April 3 in the third-place bout against NC Fusion. Guershom Sylvain and John Palomino led the team with two goals each. Le Rouge's roster featured 30 of the top youth players in Metro Detroit - including 15 from Detroit City FC's youth affiliates.

BOSH TANYI: YOUTH MAKING AN IMPACT

Bosh Tanyi returns to Detroit City FC for his third season. Tanyi will be eligible to compete not only for Le Rouge's first team, but also the Academy Cup squad. Bosh won Mr. Michigan Soccer in 2020, coming off back-to-back state titles with Grosse Ile HS under former DCFC standout Jon Evans. Last season, Bosh was a main fixture on DCFC's U23 squad that went 13-0-1 and won the Midwest Premiere League's East Division. In just 14 matches, the Le Rouge U23's posted a +29 goal differential, outscoring its opposition 40-11.

HOPPENOT TALLIES LE ROUGE'S FIRST-EVER GOAL IN USL CHAMPIONSHIP

In the 50th minute against Charleston on March 19, Forward Antoine Hoppenot tallied Detroit City's first-ever goal in the USL Championship. The goal was Hoppenot's 36th (includes playoffs) as a player in the USL Championship. Centerback Matt Lewis had DCFC's first goal as a professional club on Feb. 28, 2020 at LA Force while in NISA. Stefan St. Louis had the Club's first-ever goal on May 12, 2012 against Cleveland while in the NPSL.

STEINWASCHER SHINES IN DEBUT, EARNS WEEK ONE TOTW SELECTION

Goalkeeper Nate Steinwascher made a league-high five saves in his USL Championship debut on March 12 at San Antonio FC. Steinwascher made his presence felt early in the fixture, turning aside a penalty kick in the 19th minute after a hand ball in the box. Steinwascher was rated the No. 7 overall player in the USL Championship by FotMob through week one as Steinwascher was named to the USL Championship's Team of the Week.

RECAPING THE PRESEASON

Detroit City FC's preseason featured a handful of friendlies, two coming against USL Championship foes. Le Rouge opened the preseason in Indianapolis with Indy Eleven, battling to a 1-1 draw. Connor Rutz tallied City's goal off a free kick in the 4th minute. After

NEVER A LOSING SEASON FOR THE MENS SIDE

Celebrating its 10th anniversary in 2022, Le Rouge enters its debut season in the USL Championship having never had a losing season. The closest DCFC came to a losing season was a mark of 4-4-4 in 2016 competing in the NPSL.

CARROLL RETURNS AS LONGEST-ACTIVE CAPTAIN IN DETROIT SPORTS

Steve Carroll returns for his sixth season with Le Rouge, fourth with the captain's armband. Carroll is the longest-tenured active captain in Detroit professional sports. The centerback from Cork, Ireland, has been a regular starter since his arrival in 2017. No other captain in DCFC history has lifted as much hardware, as the Club has claimed nine trophies since 2019 on the men's side. Carroll was the 2020 NISA Golden Ball winner and led all defenders with four goals during the 2021 NISA Fall campaign.

INTERNATIONAL CAPS

Billy Forbes and Deklan Wynne bring national team experience to Detroit City FC's 2022 roster. Forbes has made 19 career caps for his native country of Turks and Caicos Islands. Deklan Wynne also has made 15 career international cap4321s. Wynne was born in South Africa but holds citizenship in New Zealand where he grew up in the national system - making appearances for the U20, U23 and senior team. His first international cap came in 2014.

MOVING THE CLUB FORWARD INTO THE USL

On November 9, 2021, Detroit City FC announced its intention to move from U.S. Soccer's third tier with NISA to the second division with the USL Championship. The move also included the women's team moving out of the UWS into the USL W League.

"It's clear that the time is right for Detroit City FC to move forward by joining the USL Championship," said Detroit City FC Co-Owner and Chief Executive Officer Sean Mann. "This puts us on track to accomplish many of our shared objectives such as fielding a professional women's side, enhancing our academy program, upgrading our facilities, and expanding our reach. Since 2012, our vision for Detroit City FC has been to become Detroit's soccer club for all time. We strive to be the most inclusive, community-focused, and supporter-driven club in the USA."

ABOUT DETROIT CITY FC

Founded in 2012, Detroit City FC has established itself as one of the most talked about soccer teams in North America. Our club motto, Passion for Our City, Passion for the Game, evokes the three ideas the grassroots organization was built upon: to satisfy the demand for soccer in downtown Detroit, represent the city in a positive light, and build community through "the beautiful game."

The seed of DCFC was planted in 2010, on the soccer pitch at Belle Isle in downtown Detroit. That grass - the very same that was transported from the Pontiac Silverdome after the 1994 World Cup - was the original home of the Detroit City Futbol League (DCFL), a co-ed, recreational league that

pitted players from teams representing the many historic neighborhoods of Detroit.

Founded as a community organizing endeavor aiming to bring city residents together, the league was wildly successful, quickly drawing over 1000 players a week to the games and after parties at bars across the city. Inspired by the success, DCFL founder Sean Mann pitched four friends an idea to further tap into the growing interest in the sport by founding a minor league soccer team to play in downtown Detroit. Ten years later, Detroit City FC has climbed the U.S. Soccer pyramid from an amateur success story to the second division of professional soccer.

REGULAR SEASON STRUCTURE

The 2022 USL Championship season will see every team play each of its conference foes twice – once at home, once away. For Eastern Conference clubs, the remaining eight games will be against interconference opponents – four at home, four away. For Western Conference clubs, the remaining 10 games will be against a combination of interconference and intraconference opponents – five at home, five away.

2022 USL CHAMPIONSHIP PLAYOFFS

At the conclusion of the regular season, the top seven teams in each conference will qualify for the 2022 USL Championship Playoffs. The first overall seed in each conference will receive a bye to the Conference Semifinals of the playoffs. The bracket will be reseeded following the Conference Quarterfinals to ensure the first overall seed in each conference plays against the lowest-seeded remaining opponent. The USL Championship Playoffs will remain a single-elimination format, culminating in the 2022 USL Championship Final on Sunday, November 13.

A LOOK AT THE OPPOSITION: Indy Eleven

Coming into this Saturday's game, Indy Eleven currently sits in 9th place in the Eastern Conference with 25 points and with a record of 8-4-14. The Eleven have scored just 26 goals this season, which has them in 26th place in the league and they have conceded 38 goals which ties them for 14th place. Their goal difference is -12 over their 26 games played. Indy has taken 236 shots where they sit in last place (27th) and their conversion rate is 14%, which has them tied for 16th. They have committed 355 fouls (14th place) and they have received 70 yellow cards which ties them for 7th. This season they have had three clean sheets, where they are tied for 23rd place.

Indy Eleven's record over their last five games is 2-0-3 and they are currently on a two-match winning streak. In their last two games they have upset both top of the Eastern Conference, Louisville City FC 2-1, and Western Conference leaders San Antonio FC 1-0. Indy went winless from June 4th to August 27th. They lost most recently three games in row to the Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC (2-0), the Hartford Athletic (2-1), and FC Tulsa (1-0). City has already played the Eleven earlier this season on July 9th, which City won 1-0.

Forward Stéfano Pinho has nine goals this season, which ties him in 17th place overall in the league. Pinho just scored the two goals in Indy's big 2-1 win over Louisville City FC this week. With his three assists, 37 shots this season and 123 aerial duels, he is in 1st on the team. He is 2nd on the team with 14 chances created. He was named to The Team of the Week on Week 7. Forward Manuel Arteaga is 1st on the team with 20 shots on target, tied for 1st with 33 shots, 2nd on the team with five goals and 14 chances created and 3rd with two assists. He also leads the team with 266 duels and 115 duels won. For Week 13, Arteaga was named to Team of the Week, as well as earning Player of the Week. Defender Mechack Jérôme has played in 22 of Indy's games this season. He leads the team with 1,084 passes, 81 clearances and 36 interceptions.

Indy Eleven's Head Coach is Mark Lowry and he became Indy's fourth permanent head coach on November 16th, 2021. His was previously with the El Paso Locomotive where he was the head coach for three seasons. His record over the three season was 42W-29T-19L in the USL Championship Regular Season, USL Championship Playoffs and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup 2019-2021. Prior to El Paso and Indy, Lowry coached at the Jacksonville Armada.

Trevor James will lead Detroit City FC in its inaugural USL Championship season after 30 years of coaching and scouting at the highest levels of soccer in the United States and Europe.

Following his retirement from professional soccer in 1985, James moved into the coaching ranks with stints as staff at Ipswich Town FC and Colchester United before working for Sir Bobby Robson as a freelance scout at FC Barcelona ('96-'97), Newcastle ('01-'02), FC Porto ('94-'96), Sporting Lisbon ('92) and the England national team during the buildup to the 1990 World Cup.

From 2006-2010, James was Assistant Coach for the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer, serving under three different head coaches during his tenure (Frank Yallop, Ruud Gullit, and Bruce Arena), as well as serving as the interim head coach on two occasions. In addition to his first team duties, he was promoted to Director of Player Development where he oversaw the creation and growth of the LA Galaxy Youth Academy.

As one of the most respected and longest serving assistant coaches in MLS, James served as Assistant Head Coach for the Portland Timbers from 2010-2012. From 2014 to 2015, James was the Director of Scouting and Assistant Technical Director for the Chicago Fire before he returned to a coaching role with Indy Eleven of the North American Soccer League (NASL) for the league's final season. He was named Technical Director of Indy Eleven in 2017 and oversaw the club's transition to USL.

James was announced as the general manager and head coach of Detroit City FC in January of 2019. James oversaw Le Rouge's move from an amateur side to a professional club - winning the 2019 Member's Cup before kicking off play in the National Independent Soccer Association in 2020.
