Patriots Point Complex, Mount Pleasant, S.C. • Nov. 2, 2024 Eastern Conference Quarterfinals

Last Meeting with N.C. Riverhounds 0, North Carolina FC 0

WakeMed Soccer Park, Cary, N.C. • June 22, 2024 Regular season

The two teams played to their second draw of 2024, battling each other and 90-degree heat. North Carolina had 62.9 percent of possession in the match, but despite having less of the ball, the Hounds held the hosts without a shot on goal on seven attempts, earning Jacob Randolph his first professional shutout.

GAME 1 - QUICK STRIKES

- The Riverhounds are kicking off their 26th season of competition, having first taken the field in 1999. Among professional teams currently in the USL, only the Charleston Battery and Richmond Kickers, both founded in 1993, are older.
- Today's March 8 opening date is the earliest start to a regular season in the Hounds' history.
- This is the eighth year in a row the Hounds are opening the season on the road. The Hounds are 2-3-2 in those matches after losing 1-0 last year in the opener at New Mexico, and the team is 7-9-9 overall in season openers.
- The Hounds are coming off a seventh consecutive season qualifying for the USL Championship Playoffs. That streak is the second-longest active streak in the league behind Louisville City FC (10 seasons), and it is the longest current streak among Pittsburgh's four professional sports teams.
- Last season, the Hounds lost only once in their last 16 regularseason matches, going 9-1-6 to rally for a playoff berth.
- Goalkeeper Eric Dick claimed the USL Championship's Golden Glove for the lowest goals-against average 2024, allowing only 18 goals in 26 matches (0.69 GAA). He is the team's secondever winner of the award, joining Danny Vitiello in 2020.
- Dick also recorded a team-record 14 clean sheets, eclipsing the mark of 13 set by Kyle Morton in 2019, on his way to Goalkeeper of the Year and First Team All-League honors.
- Danny Griffin enters the season wearing the captain's armband for the second year. The sixth-year pro's durability is unmatched in club history, having reached 150 appearances in all competitions while missing only two league matches since 2020.
- Bertin Jacquesson, who signed a permanent deal with the Hounds in the offseason after joining on loan last September from Real Salt Lake, made a quick impact with the team, recording five goals and two assists in eight matches.
- Pittsburgh native Robbie Mertz led the team with five assists a season ago, only the second time since 2018 that a player
- other than Kenardo Forbes topped the team in that category. Hounds coach Bob Lilley has amassed 405 wins leading professional clubs in his career, more than any active coach in
- U.S. pro leagues, men's or women's. In 239 matches played under Lilley in all competitions, the Hounds are 118-54-67 and have allowed just 217 goals, an

average of 0.91 goals per game.

- Robbie Mertz enters the year with 18 goals and 19 assists for the Hounds. The only two players who have amassed 20 of each in Hounds' history are David Flavius (62, 26) and Kevin Kerr (32, 29).
- In just one season with the Hounds, Eric Dick climbed into a tie for fifth in club history with 14 clean sheets, matching the number posted by Danny Vitiello. He is four behind Kyle Morton, who holds fourth place with 18.

Announced as the club's 10th head coach in its history on Nov. 14, 2017, Bob Lilley is in his eighth season at the helm for Riverhounds SC.

Across 24 seasons of head coaching at the pro level, Lilley holds an all-time record of 405-195-189, giving him more wins than any other active coach at in the U.S. at the professional club level. Excluding his one season coaching indoor soccer, he has 383 wins leading outdoor professional clubs, more than any coach in U.S. pro league history — men's or women's — stretching from the present day to before the beginning of the original NASL (1968-84). He has logged at least a .500 winning percentage during every regular season, and he has led his team into the postseason every year.

In seven seasons leading the Hounds, the veteran head coach has transformed the team into a perennial contender. The Hounds have qualified for the postseason in all seven seasons under Lilley after reaching the playoffs in only 8 of 18 seasons prior to his arrival.

In 2023, Lilley and the Hounds had their most successful season to date by posting a 19-5-10 record and winning the USL Championship Players' Shield for the first time with the league's best record. The team also advanced to the quarterfinals of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup for only the second time, knocking off a pair of MLS teams in the process, and their 23 overall wins established a new single-season record across all competitions. For his work, Lilley was named Coach of the Year for the second time in the USL Championship and the sixth time overall.

His time in Pittsburgh has been marked by new levels of success for the team, which also includes a 19-4-11 regular-season record in 2019. The 68 points were the most in team history, as the team finished atop the USL Championship Eastern Conference standings. The club also made the postseason in his first year, 2018, ending a two-season playoff drought with the first-ever playoff match at Highmark Stadium. Lilley has posted a 118-54-67 overall record with the Hounds, the most wins by any coach in club history, and the most for Lilley at any of his career's coaching stops.

Lilley came to Pittsburgh after coaching USL's Rochester Rhinos, which he led during two separate stints (2014-17 and 2010-11). In his six seasons with the Rhinos, Lilley compiled a 102-48-53 overall record, the highlight of which was 2015, in which his team went 17-1-10 in the regular season en route to the Rhinos' last USL title. He was named Coach of the Year in 2015, an honor he also took in 2010, when Rochester won the USSF Division 2 Professional League regular-season title. Before joining Rochester, Lilley spent 2007-08 as head coach of the Detroit Ignition of the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL), earning Coach of the Year honors as the Ignition went 22-8, the best record in the league.

For three seasons (2005-07), Lilley served as head coach for the Vancouver Whitecaps of the USL First Division, winning his first league championship in 2006. From 2002-03, he led the Montreal Impact of the USL A-League, winning Coach of the Year honors in 2003. Vincent signed with Hounds in 2013, the same year Highmark Stadium opened, and played three years for the club. In 2015, the midfielder had a breakout season with 21 goals in all competitions — still tied for the second-most in club history — and was named to the USL All-League First Team.

Busch also represented the United States in international play as part of the Under-17 team in the 1993 World Championship. He remained in the U.S. player pool and made his only start at the senior level in 2005, recording a shutout against Colombia, 3-0.




